2025 ANNUAL REPORT

Supported **26 community-based** watershed groups to protect our shared waters across the Hudson Valley.

Highlights:

- Worked directly with 12 watershed groups to grow strong organizations and leaders, with strategy, mission and vision, organizational structures, and tools to achieve their local clean water and resilience goals.
- Organized webinars and meetings to share innovative new projects, strategies, and to foster stronger connections between groups.

Co-facilitated the **Hudson Valley Flood Resilience Network**, connecting local governments taking action to manage current and future flood risks.

Highlights:

- Provided two new trainings through the Network, supporting 70 local leaders and regional partners to improve local land use policies and crisis communications when facing a major flood.
- Organized virtual and in-person meetings with 96 Network members and partners on priority topics, including funding opportunities, stormwater solutions, flood buy-outs, and more.
