Applications will be reviewed and scored by a team including staff from the Hudson River Watershed Alliance and NYS DEC Hudson River Estuary Program based on the following criteria.

#### **Eligibility**

This section will determine watershed group eligibility for this technical assistance opportunity. To be eligible, the answer to all three questions must be Yes.

Is the applicant a watershed group, defined as a collective of people that are working together locally to protect a specific watershed?

### **Watershed Group Timing/Readiness**

The questions in this section will be scored.

Has the watershed group met regularly within the last year?

Yes = 5 points, No = 0 points

What organizational development or capacity challenges is your watershed group currently facing?

Scored from 0 to 10 points, based on the ability to articulate organizational development or capacity challenges.

Why is this technical assistance opportunity timely for your watershed group?

Scored from 0 to 10 points, based on the timeliness of this opportunity and outcomes anticipated from supporting the watershed group during this timeframe.

Does this technical assistance opportunity support next steps related to any specific watershed planning processes or other projects? This could include past, present, or future planning or other projects.

Scored from 0 to 5 points, based on the opportunity to coordinate with and leveraging other projects, to improve outcomes.

The questions in this section will not be scored, but will help us have a better understanding of your group's current structure.

How frequently does your watershed group meet? Does your watershed group have a standing meeting day and time?

Are your watershed group meetings held in-person, virtually, or hybrid?
